Haw Would You Respond?

William is a 46-year-old male visiting his primary care provider for a routine check-up. His physician notes William's father was diagnosed with colon cancer at the age of 53, which puts William at an increased risk for developing the same cancer. She mentions the American Cancer Society has changed the age at which colorectal cancer screening should begin for those at higher risk and strongly recommends William schedule a colonoscopy. William responds that he read about someone who was screened and had major complications. William: "No way I'm getting that done; I'll take my chances with cancer." **Response:** William should be educated on the need for colonoscopy. His dad was diagnosed at 53 years, and he should have started screening at age 43 years old. Risks of colonoscopy are low in someone at his age and the benefit outweighs any risk at this age.

<u>Up To Date</u>: Colon perforation is the most important complication of colonoscopy (1.96 per 1000 colonoscopies, odds ratio [OR] 0.56) [84]. Comorbidities and older age increased the risk of perforation.
